9 Films from Campuses at IDSFFK

Under the 'Competitive Campus Films' category, nine young filmmakers will exhibit their films at the 12th International Documentary and Short Film Festival of Kerala (IDSFFK). These films attempt to bring to screens the issues faced in the different spheres of the society and portrays the realities and nuances of life.

The film 'Oru Kochu Moham' directed by Satyajith Gopikrishna draws the emotion of losing something valuable to fulfill the wish of another. 'Aham' by Sooraj S, is about the inequality and injustice faced by the transgender community, when every man and woman is given the permission to vote. Noufal Nazeer with his film 'Dhaya' narrates the tale of a the human emotions of a person who has been paralysed due to an accident, and how people regard him with pity.

'Kuyil' by Fazil Razaka, brings to the audience the struggles of a young village girl and her striving to achieve her dream career in acting. Selvaraj R, speaks of social responsibilities and the absolute inevitability of water preservation, in 'Locker'. 'Oorali Band' is a musical documentary directed by Arjun P S which is about Oorali, the music band from Kochi, Kerala, that follows a conversational style of music to raise issues that affect the common public.

Gayathri Sivaprakash's 'Prathichaya' brings to screens the concept of puppets paving way for cinema and the similarities between cinema and Tholppavakkoothu, a form of puppetry. 'Purath' by Vinayak Suthan brings out the realities and alienation faced by a girl, after killing the man who raped her. Through 'Weaving Dreams' (Chendamangalam Handlooms) director Naveen C. Wilson portrays the challenged and problems that handloom weavers face in the wake of development and the calamities.

IDSFFK encourages campus filmmakers in bringing out innovative ideas, thus enriching and the film culture of the country. The Best Campus film will be awarded a prize money of Rs.50,000.
